Motif Development

Motif development as a choreographic device involves using a single movement or short movement phrase that is manipulated (eg, by varying the elements of movement, by repetition, by fragmentation, using different body parts) to develop movement sequences for a dance.

Motif development: is a procedure of a dance composition method that consists of transforming a basic choreographic motif to create a larger or whole piece of dance. Variations of the motif are done through strategies like repetition.
